# Introduction to FRED and Data sources

## How to find data on FRED?

- Use the Search Bar
- Browse categories
- Browse by Release
- Browse by Source
- Browse Using Tags

- Searching FRED by keyword is often the fastest way to find the data you need.
- From the home page, enter keywords in either search box to find the most relevant data series. The box in the upper right will offer suggested series as you begin to type, this search box is always available no matter where you navigate in FRED and is a good way to browse available series.



 Search results are initially sorted by rank to display the series you are most likely looking for. If you are not sure which series to use, the one at the top of the search results is a good bet. Click the title of any series to see the graph.

### **Browse categories**

 To browse by category, on FRED's home page, click "Category." You will be able to see at a glance how many series are available in each subject area.




### **Browse categories**

 Click any category to see all the data series in that category.



• On FRED's home page, click "Release."



 Data releases are collections of data made available (released) on a regular schedule under a given name, for example "Employment Situation" or "Consumer Credit." Each release contains a collection of individual data series. The numbers in parentheses behind the names tell you how many series are in each release on FRED. Browsing by release is another way to discover data on FRED and is especially helpful if you are already familiar with common data releases.

• On FRED's home page, click "Source."



• The "Source" option lists all data sources in alphabetical order. FRED data come from many different organizations, so browsing the sources is a good way to discover what data are available. The numbers in parentheses behind the source names tell you how many data series are available on FRED from each Source.




